TURTLECREEK TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES

ON

JULY 11

The regular scheduled meeting of the Board of Trustees of Turtlecreek Township was held on July 11, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. with the following person present:

TRUSTEES: Jim VanDeGrift, Jonathan Sams, and Daniel Jones CHIEF FISCAL OFFICER: Gregory S. Johnson GUEST: Tammy Boggs, Steve Flint, Michael Jameson, Ron Chasteen, Neil Tunison, and Michael Shaffer

The meeting opened with Mr. VanDeGrift leading the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes of the previous meeting on 6/28/2016 were received by the Trustees prior to the meeting for review. Since there were no additions or corrections, Mr. Sams moved for acceptance, seconded by Mr. Jones. All were in favor and the minutes were approved as written.

The monthly financial status reports for information entered through June 30th were given to the Trustees prior to the meeting for review. Since there were no additions or corrections, Mr. Sams moved for acceptance, seconded by Mr. Jones. All present were in favor and the reports were accepted.

Department Reports:

Fire/EMS:

Steve Flint, Fire Chief, informed the board a garage door at Station 31 was in need of repair and not in working order. Quotes to fix the door came in around \$500.00; however, one company also quoted replacing the opener completely at \$950.00. Mr. Sams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Jones to approve for the complete replacement of the opener at \$950.00. All present voiced a "YEA" vote and the motion passed with resolution **16-07-03** (a copy of the resolution will be included in the minutes.

Chief Flint also informed the board that Engine 32 was in the shop for emergency repairs due to blowing oil. Mr. Sams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Jones to accept the repair cost at what was needed to fix the engine due to the emergent needs of the repair. All present voiced a "YEA" vote and the motion passed.

Road and Bridge: Ron Chasteen, Road Supervisor, informed the board that the grinder "teeth" on the pavement attachment for the Bobcat was in need of replacement and he would begin searching for quotes to replace.

Mr. Chasteen also informed the board of a possible culvert in need of replacement on Kirby Rd. Mr. Chasteen and Mr. VanDeGrift will take a look together at the culvert issue and report back to the board on what they find.

Administration:

Mrs. Boggs, Township Administrator advised the board that a resolution was needed to cover the proposed reduction in speed on Drake Rd. from a speed study mentioned in past meetings. Mr. Jones made a motion; seconded by Mr. Sams to request ODOT to reduce the current speed limit on Drake Rd to a reasonable and safe speed. All present voiced a "YEA" vote and the motion passed with resolution **16-07-01** (a copy of the resolution will be included in the minutes).

Mrs. Boggs asked the board if they would like to move forward with the quotes for the LED replacement project for the Township Administration building. Quotes were presented to the board from Creech's Electric, Connor Electric, and Volpenhein Electric. Mr. Jones made a motion, seconded by Mr. Sams to accept the quote for work from Creech's electric being the lowest quote of \$26,775.00. All present voiced a "YEA" vote and the motion passed with resolution **16-07-02** (a copy of the resolution will be included in the minutes).

Mrs. Boggs informed the board that a noise regulation request for Turtlecreek Union Rd. was received. Mrs. Boggs spoke to the county Prosecutors office and was advised against the matter stating the ORC already has an ordinance for this. The board asked that the minutes reflect that no action was taken on this item.

Mrs. Boggs presented the board with information regarding the placement of the township logo in Site Selection Magazine at the cost of \$250.00. Mr. Sams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Jones to approve the cost related to placement of the township logo in Site Selection Magazine. All present voiced a "YEA" vote and the motion passed with resolution **16-07-04** (a copy of the resolution will be included in the minutes).

Mrs. Boggs reminded the board of a REDI (Regional Economic Development Initiative) meeting scheduled for August 10th at Miami Valley Gaming at 1:30 p.m. Mr. Sams agreed to attend the meeting on behalf of the board.

A request for a leadership speaker was presented to the board for the local school systems career day on July 15th from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. Mr. VanDeGrift agreed to be present and issue a speech for the group on the duties of a trustee.

Mrs. Boggs informed the board that a tent request has been received as part of a park reservation. Mr. Jones made a motion, seconded by Mr. Sams to allow the temporary usage of the tent during the reserved time. All present voiced a "YEA" vote and the motion passed.

Fiscal Officer Reports:

Mr. Johnson informed the board of the availability due to recent legislation to allow for the electronic transfer of OPERS payments and asked whether or not the board would want to authorize such payment method. Mr. Jones remarked that he personally liked to sign checks for such amounts. The board asked that the minutes reflect that no action was taken on this item.

Upon roll call to exit executive session, Mr. Sams "YEA", Mr. Jones "YEA", and Mr. VanDeGrift "YEA". All present voiced a "YEA" vote and the motion was passed at 08:15 p.m.

Visitor Concerns

Honorary Neil Tunison, Warren County Engineer presented the board with information regarding the repaving of a section of roadway on Turtlecreek Union Rd. and Wood Rd. The Engineer's Office estimated the project to cost a total of approximately \$626,000.00. Mr. Tunison advised the board that he had been in contact with officials from Union Township regarding splitting the cost of the project with Turtlecreek picking up approximately \$336,000.00 and Union Township picking up the rest of the cost at approximately \$290,000.00. The board of trustees made mention this has been a stretch of road that has received numerous complaints and agreed it is in need of repair. Mr. Tunison also presented the board with the option to apply for a Ohio Public Works Commission Loan at zero percent interest for 10 years. Mr. Sams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Jones to approve the project in principal and will take up financing of the project and final project approval at a later date.

There being no further business, Mr. Sams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Jones to adjourn the meeting. All present voiced a "YEA" vote and the motion passed.

RESOLUTION 16-07-01 TURTLECREEK TOWNSHP WARREN COUNTY, OHIO

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATIONS TO ESTABLISH A REASONABLE AND SAFE SPEED LIMIT ON DRAKE ROAD

WHEREAS, a request has been made to this Board of Trustees that the statutory vehicular speed limit established by Ohio Revised Code, Sec. 4511.21 is greater than that considered reasonable and safe on Drake Road (between Route 42 & Miller Road, Turtlecreek Township's area),

WHEREAS, the Warren County Engineer has performed an engineering and traffic investigation upon the section of road described, and;

WHEREAS, it is the belief of this Board that such investigation confirms the allegation that the statutory speed limit of 45mph is unrealistic,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees, Turtlecreek Township that:

Section 1. By virtue of the provisions of Ohio Revised Code, Sec. 4511.21, the Director of Transportation is hereby requested to review the engineering and traffic investigation prepared by the Warren County Engineer and to determine and declare a reasonable and safe prima facie speed limit on Drake Road (between Route 42 & Miller Road, Turtlecreek Township's area) and ;

Section 2. That when the Board is advised that the Director of Highways has determined and declared a reasonable and safe speed limit on the section of road described in Section 1 hereof, standard signs, properly posted and giving notices thereof, will be erected.

Mr. Jones moved to adopt the foregoing Resolution. Mr. Sams seconded the motion. All voiced a "YEA" vote and the Resolution was passed.
